Now let's practice adding -or to verbs to make nouns. First, review the rules. This will help you correctly apply the pattern.

We can add -or to verbs to make nouns. We *usually* add -or when a verb is two or more syllables.

Here are some rules to help you with spelling:

	dictate <u>e</u> + or = dictator	<i>verb ends in a silent e (remove the e and add -or)</i>
	edit <u>t</u> + or = editor	<i>verb ends in one or more consonants (add -or)</i>
	inspect <u>t</u> + or = inspector	<i>verb ends in one or more consonants (add -or)</i>
